

Now read Source 3, 'Stranded on Vanuatu', which is an extract from a non-fiction book.

- 3 Explain some of the thoughts and feelings the writer has whilst he is on the island.

The article begins by highlighting the evidently downbeat and almost bitter feelings of the writer. The references to "unbearable heat" and "ghastly" insects begin to bring this point into clear the forefront of the paragraph as we realise this is the true emotion of the reader - to somewhat "unbearable". The use of sarcasm in the first line also shows the bitter feelings of the writer. As the first line concludes, "there isn't". This short and blunt statement shows the writer's loss of patience and good humour and begins to explain and interpret his resentments of his surroundings. This resentment is highlighted shown more clearly when the writer almost demonises the insects around him by saying they want to

"get at [his] sweat". The reference to the Bluebottles as "tumours" also effectively portrays the "hostility" the writer feels towards his situation.

There is a sense however that at some point, the writer was able to appreciate his surroundings as he has clearly noted the magnitude of them such as the "dramatically" setting sun or the "ring of coral". However, these feelings (if they ever occurred at all) were long overtaken by the resounding fear and feeling of isolation of the writer.

This feeling of fear becomes especially apparent towards the end of the article as the writer begins to feel increasingly "lost". The ~~reference~~ to account of the writer as a "little kid in England" also shows

The piece concludes with the
altogether more worrying
feelings of the writer that see
show his regret and perhaps
even loss of self worth as
he wonders whether he may
go "unmissed". The writer

and from his home, a "galaxy"
away.
